

## **FEDERAL MANAGERS, OPERATORS, AND REGULATORS**

### **U.S. DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY: WESTERN AREA POWER ADMINISTRATION**

Description: The Department of Energy (DOE) provides the framework for a comprehensive national energy plan through the coordination and administration of the energy functions of the federal government. Western Area Power Administration (Western or WAPA) is the sole federal power marketing agency in the West and the region's major wholesaler of electricity. Western markets and transmits power, and coordinates operation of the Colorado River Storage Project. Although it lacks authority to build or own dams or powerplants, Western does own and operate, within its service area, the network of long-distance, high-voltage transmission lines. Though part of DOE, Western is not funded by tax revenues. The agency recovers the cost of operations and maintenance mainly through its electricity rates.

The major purpose of the Compact is to provide for the equitable division and apportionment of the use of the waters of the Colorado River System. The Upper Colorado River Commission aids the States in the development of their respective shares of the waters and maintains close contacts with the member States' water resource agencies and with the legislative and executive branches of the Federal Government.
